
HUBZone Small Business FY2021 Prime Contracting

Historically Underutilized Business Zones (HUBZone) Small Businesses are expanding and contributing to the economy at a record-breaking level. By competing for and winning federal contracts, HUBZone small businesses have supported over 61K jobs, driving job creation, innovation, and economic growth on a local, regional, and national level.



Outreach Efforts

- SBA continued promotion of recent HUBZone program improvements to agency contracting officials and small businesses by hosting training sessions and publishing updated information on sba.gov/HUBZone.
- SBA continued collaboration with Procurement Technical Assistance Centers and other resources to help procurement-ready firms submit applications and compete in the federal marketplace.

Advocating for Small Business

- The program fuels growth of small businesses in HUBZones by certifying eligible firms and granting preferential access to federal contracts.
- The Federal government goal is to award at least 3% of all federal contracting dollars to HUBZone-certified small businesses each year. Visit <u>HUBZone Program</u>

FY2021 Highlights

- The Federal government has exceeded the small business contracting goal for the ninth consecutive year.
- The government awarded a record breaking \$154.2* billion in prime contracts to small business in FY 2021.
- The federal government continued an upward trajectory toward its HUBZone goal, awarding 2.53%* of federal dollars to HUBZone firms.
- HUBZone-certified small businesses received over \$14.3 billion, equating to more than 61,000 jobs in disadvantaged communities.
- Over 2,800 HUBZone small business prime contractors (3% total Small Business vendors) received awards, and total awards averaged \$5.0 million per HUBZone contractor.
