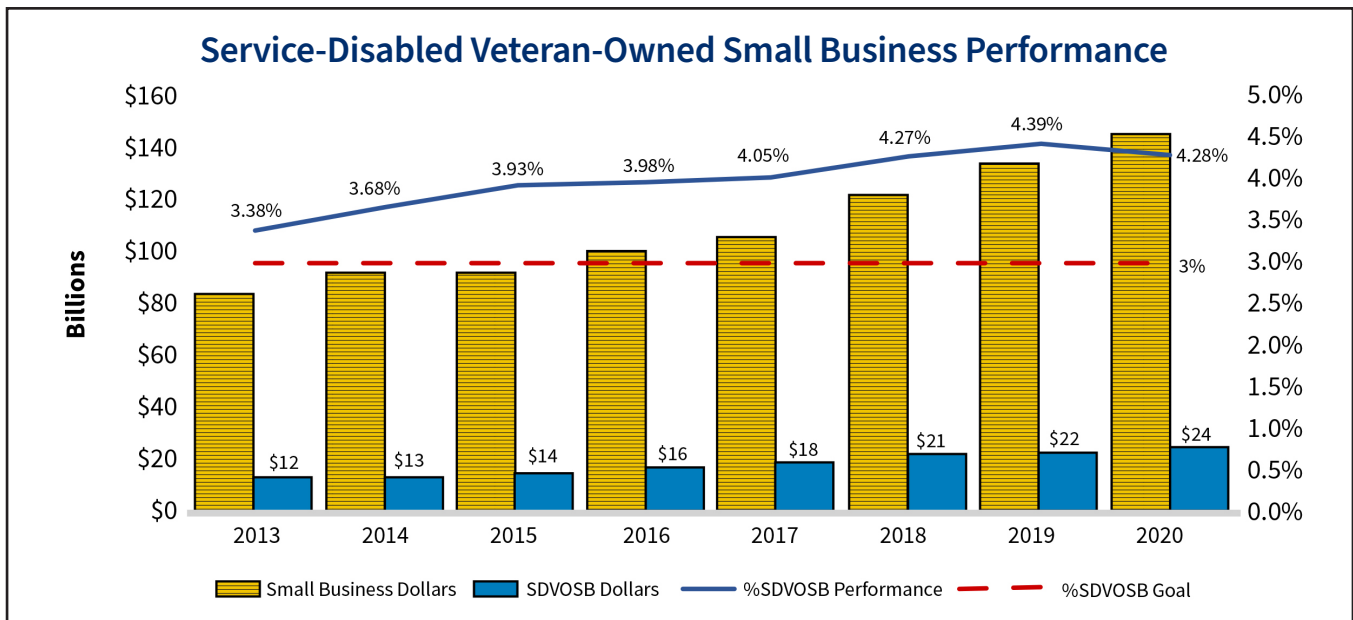


Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Prime Contracting FY2020

Small businesses are expanding and contributing to the economy at a record-breaking level. By competing for and winning federal contracts, small businesses have supported about 699K jobs, driving job creation, innovation, and economic growth on a local, regional, and national level.



Outreach Efforts

SBA continued outreach on certification programs and education on federal contracting to veteran population through Veteran Business Opportunity Centers, veteran-focused events, and social media.

Advocating for Small Business

- SBA Recently **lessened the regulatory burden** on veteran- business owners by consolidating ownership and control requirements into one regulation. (SBA Final Rule 83 FR 48908)
 - Lessened requirement** that a service-disabled veteran (SDV) make all decisions.
 - Defines “extraordinary circumstances”** in which a non-SDV can have shared decision-making authority.
 - Established that **control could shift** when the veteran is called to active duty.
 - Surviving spouse** can own and control 100% of the SDVOSB **for up to 10 years** after the veteran’s death.

FY2020 Highlights

- The federal government **exceeded the small business contracting goal** for the eighth-consecutive year.
- Awarded record-breaking **\$145.7* billion** in prime contracts to small business.
- More than \$23.9* billion** in contracts were awarded to Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned small businesses; could equate to over **119K jobs**.
- Prime contracts awarded to over **5,400 SDVOSB** - over 7% total small business vendors.
- Average award of **\$4.3 million** per prime contractor.



The SBA is responsible for verifying and issuing regulations relating to ownership and control of small businesses for the Department of Veterans Affairs for Veteran-Owned (VO) and Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (SDVOSB). *National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2017*
