SBA DECLARATION #R105 -- MILITARY RESERVIST ECONOMIC INJURY DISASTER LOAN PROGRAM

Small businesses employing military reservists may apply for economic injury disaster loans if those employees are called up to active duty during a period of military conflict existing on or after March 24, 1999 and those employees are essential to the success of the small business daily operations. The filing period for small businesses to apply for economic injury loan assistance under the Military Reservist Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (MREIDL) begins the date the essential employee is ordered to active duty and ends on the date 90 days after the essential employee is discharged or released from active duty.

SBA DECLARATION #9AF6 -- SEVERE STORMS AND FLOODING FROM THE REMNANTS OF HURRICANE JEANNE

Homeowners, renters, business owners and nonprofit organizations in the independent cities of Roanoke and Salem and the primary counties of Alleghany, Botetourt, Craig, Floyd, Giles, Montgomery, Patrick and Roanoke in the Commonwealth of Virginia are eligible to apply for an SBA disaster loan to cover physical losses resulting from the severe storms and flooding from the remnants of Hurricane Jeanne that occurred September 27 through September 30, 2004. Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) are available to small businesses located in the independent cities and primary counties, as well as the contiguous counties of Bath, Bedford, Bland, Carroll, Franklin, Henry, Pulaski and Rockbridge in the Commonwealth of Virginia; Stokes and Surry in the State of North Carolina; and Greenbrier, Mercer, Monroe and Summers in the State of West Virginia. However, to be eligible for consideration under the SBA disaster program, losses sustained must be the result of the severe storms and flooding from the remnants of Hurricane Jeanne.

The deadline for filing Physical loan applications is December 17, 2004.

The deadline for filing EIDLs is July 18, 2005.
