SBA DISASTER LOAN DEADLINE IS MAY 12 *SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS STILL HAVE TIME TO APPLY*

ATLANTA -The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses that **May 12** is the filing deadline for federal economic injury disaster loans that are available to small businesses located in declared counties in the State of Indiana as a result of damages and losses to crops caused by frost and snow April 4 – 10, 2007.

The Small Business Administration's disaster declaration was issued as a result of a similar action taken by the Secretary of Agriculture to help farmers recover from this disaster. Under this declaration, the SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to farm-related and non-farm related small business concerns and small agricultural cooperatives that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible to apply to the SBA.

Eligible small businesses may qualify for loans up to \$1.5 million. These loans are available at a 4 percent interest rate with terms up to 30 years. The SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based upon each applicant's financial condition. Under this disaster declaration, the SBA cannot provide loans to agricultural producers.

These loans are available to small businesses located in the following primary counties in the State of Indiana: Brown, Clark, Dearborn, Hancock, Henry, Howard, Jackson, Jasper, Jefferson, Johnson, Knox, Lake, Lawrence, Monroe, Morgan, Newton, Ohio, Orange, Owen, Posey, Rush, Scott, Shelby, Starke, Washington and Wayne.

In addition, small businesses located in the following contiguous counties in the State of Indiana may apply: Bartholomew, Benton, Carroll, Cass, Clay, Clinton, Crawford, Daviess, Decatur, Delaware, Dubois, Fayette, Floyd, Franklin, Fulton, Gibson, Grant, Greene, Hamilton, Harrison, Hendricks, Jennings, LaPorte, Madison, Marion, Marshall, Martin, Miami, Pike, Porter, Pulaski, Putnam, Randolph, Ripley, St. Joseph, Sullivan, Switzerland, Tipton, Union, Vanderburgh and White.
