SBA DISASTER LOAN DEADLINE IS DECEMBER 8 *SMALL BUSINESS OWNERS STILL HAVE TIME TO APPLY*

ATLANTA - The U.S. Small Business Administration is reminding businesses that **December 8** is the filing deadline for federal economic injury disaster loans that are available to small businesses located in the counties of Bristol, Newport and Providence in the State of Rhode Island as a result of the drought and extreme heat that occurred July 15, 2007 through December 31, 2007.

“These counties are eligible because they are contiguous to one or more primary counties in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. The Small Business Administration recognizes that disasters do not usually stop at the county or state lines. For that reason, counties adjacent to primary counties named in the declaration are included,” according to Frank Skaggs, Director of SBA Field Operations Center East.

“When the Secretary of Agriculture issues a disaster declaration to help farmers recover from damages and losses to crops, SBA issues a declaration to assist small businesses affected by the same disaster,” said Skaggs.

Under this declaration, SBA’s Economic Injury Disaster Loan program is available to farm-related and nonfarm-related small business concerns and small agricultural cooperatives that suffered financial losses as a direct result of this disaster. Farmers and ranchers are not eligible to apply to the SBA but nurseries are eligible to apply for economic injury disaster loans for losses caused by drought conditions.

Eligible small businesses may qualify for loans up to \$1.5 million. These loans are available at a 4 percent interest rate with terms up to 30 years. SBA determines eligibility for the program based on the size and type of business and its financial resources. Loan amounts and terms are set by the SBA and are based upon each applicant’s financial condition. Under this disaster declaration, the SBA cannot provide loans to agricultural producers.

Completed loan applications must be returned to SBA no later than December 8, 2008.
