SBA Offers Disaster Assistance to Texas Residents and Businesses Affected by Wildland Fires

Sacramento, CA – U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) Administrator Karen G. Mills announced the availability of low-interest disaster loans for residents and business owners affected by the wildland fires in Montague County that occurred April 7 through April 12, 2009. SBA acted under its own authority to declare a disaster in response to a request from Governor Rick Perry following the denial May 8 of the state’s request for a major disaster declaration.

The disaster declaration makes SBA assistance available in the Texas counties of **Clay, Cooke, Jack, Montague** and **Wise** and the Oklahoma counties of **Jefferson** and **Love**.

“The U.S. Small Business Administration is strongly committed to providing the most effective and customer-focused response possible to assist Texas residents and businesses with federal disaster loans,” said Mills. “Getting our businesses and communities up and running after a disaster is our highest priority at SBA.”

“Low-interest Federal disaster loans are available to homeowners, renters, businesses of all sizes and private, non-profit organizations whose property was damaged or destroyed by the disaster,” said Herbert Austin, SBA’s Dallas/Ft. Worth District Director. “Beginning Monday, May 18 at 8 am, SBA customer service representatives will be on hand at the following Disaster Loan Outreach Center to issue loan applications, answer questions about SBA’s disaster loan program, explain the application process and help each individual complete their application,” Austin continued. The center will be open on the days and times indicated. No appointment is necessary.

Disaster loans up to \$200,000 are available to homeowners to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate. Homeowners and renters are eligible for up to \$40,000 to repair or replace damaged or destroyed personal property.

Businesses of any size and private, non-profit organizations may borrow up to \$2 million to repair or replace damaged or destroyed real estate, machinery and equipment, inventory, and other business assets. SBA can also lend additional funds to homeowners and businesses to help with the cost of making improvements that protect, prevent or minimize the same type of disaster damage from occurring in the future.

For small businesses and most private, non-profit organizations of any size, SBA offers Economic Injury Disaster Loans (EIDLs) to help meet working capital needs caused by the disaster. EIDL assistance is available regardless of whether the business suffered any property damage.

Applicants may apply online using the Electronic Loan Application (ELA) via SBA's secure Web site at <https://disasterloan.sba.gov/ela>.

Hearing impaired individuals may call (800) 877-8339.

The filing deadline to return applications for property damage is **July 13, 2009**. The deadline to return economic injury applications is **February 15, 2010**.
